Pentecostal and Charismatic Research Archive

The DuPree Holiness Pentecostal Center (DHPC) has been awarded a grant from the University of Southern California (USC). Funded by the John Templeton Foundation, the grant entitled, Pentecostal and Charismatic Research Archive (PCRA), has established a center in Florida with the purpose to gather, catalog, digitize and upload records including books, articles, journalistic accounts, tracts, sermons, diaries, photographs, posters, church literature, oral histories, media tapes, periodicals, academic theses, and dissertations to the University of Southern California library server. Prioritized will be documents related to the Church of God in Christ, the Church of Christ (Holiness) USA, and the Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ of the Apostolic Faith. However, DHPC is representing all African American Holiness Pentecostal organizations. The ultimate goal is to make previously unavailable material related to the Holiness Pentecostal Movement accessible on an international level. Sherry Sherrod DuPree, Ed.S. (University of Michigan) is a wife, a mother of three sons, an author, and a retired professor from Santa Fe College. In 1988, she was appointed by Dr. Wilma Hughey to the Archival Historical Committee of The Church of God in Christ, Memphis, Tennessee; in 1987 she was a Smithsonian Institution Fellow; and in 2000 was the first black female President of the Society for Pentecostal Studies (SPS). Presently, she is a Library of Congress Ambassador; an archivist at the International Gospel Music Hall of Fame and Museum in Detroit; a board member of the Rosewood Heritage Foundation; a Florida Humanities Scholar; and director of The United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Transatlantic Slave Trade (TST) Florida Center. DuPree is listed in *Black Authors & Published Writers Directory*, *Who's Who Among Black Americans*, *Who's Who in American Education 2004-2005*, *Who's Who in America 2006*, *The Contemporary Authors*, vol. 153 and selected international sources.

As the results of this collaboration many finding aids will be available to support USC libraries Internet searches. Internet blogs and social networks will promote the use of these digital images as a new and previously unavailable method to research the Church of God in Christ and other African American Holiness Pentecostal denominations.

This National African American Holiness Pentecostal Project started in 1980 by DuPree receiving the first grant from The University of Florida in 1981. DuPree's *Biographical Dictionary* in 1990 opened the door to additional support from the Gatorade Foundation, the National and Florida Humanities Councils. In 1993, two books were published. Under the auspices of the African American Holiness Pentecostal Research Project, research has expanded to include the role of religion in Africa and on American plantations. The project

has contributed to Pentecostals in the civil rights movement, historic tours, oral interviews, genealogy research, mapping of historic cemeteries and curriculum activities for students.
